Program Goals

4. collaborating across a range of stakeholders to explore perspectives and issues, and come to solutions

5. designing research projects that involve community members, from design through analysis and recommendations

6. conducting a culminating project integrating their learning and bringing it to bear on specific challenges in urban education and communities



Program Features

• Full time, flexible format

- Classes meet every Thursday evening (5-7:30PM) during Fall and Spring Semesters
 - Summer classes are shorter/more intensive and scheduled in an effort to provide at least one summer term without classes.
- -Can be completed in 2 years
- -Camden Campus (with shuttle available from Glassboro Campus)
- -4.5< graduate credits is considered full time



Application Requirements

- Completed Rowan Global Application Form
- \$65 (U.S.) non-refundable application fee
- Bachelor's degree (or its equivalent) from an accredited institution of higher learning
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended (regardless of number of credits earned)
- Current resume
- Typewritten statement of professional objectives
 - Provide reasons for pursuing the program. Describe how you might use this program to advance your career (educational goals beyond the master's level, if applicable, are also relevant).
- Two letters of recommendation
 - Letters of recommendation should be from professional administrators and include information, which attests to applicant's ability to pursue a graduate degree
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
