Combined Advanced Degree Program: P-12 English

Program Guide and Admission Requirements

The Combined Advanced Degree Program (CADP) to Certification in P-12 English is designed specifically for Rowan University undergraduates who desire to pursue a 5-year program of study leading to a BA in English, a Master of Science Degree in Teaching (MST), and initial teacher certification in New Jersey.

The following are the key points about the CADP:

- The CADP is aimed at undergraduate students who are majoring in English and who seek New Jersey teacher certification.
- The pathway to the CADP begins in the 4th, or senior, year when students take up to 9 credit hours of graduate coursework (paying undergraduate rates) that counts for both their BS degree and their MST degree. In the 5th year, students take the remainder of their education courses required for certification as well as their Clinical Practice (student teaching) full-year experience.
- The applicants for the CADP will have an undergraduate GPA of at least a 3.0.
- The CADP provides candidates (upon successful program completion) with a Master of Science degree in
 Teaching AND initial New Jersey teaching certification (a Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing CEAS)
- The CADP includes one full year of Clinical Practice (student teaching), a New Jersey state requirement.
- Students graduating from this program will be *highly qualified* and can seek employment as an English teacher in grades P-12.
- The CADP application deadline is March 31 of the junior year.

CADP: P-12 English Admission Requirements

I. APPROVED ACADEMIC MAJORS

In order to qualify for the CADP: P-12 English, candidates must be in a bachelor's degree program with a major in English. Writing Arts and Communication are currently NOT identified majors for English certification in NJ. Some related majors may have equivalent courses that total 30 credits in the coherent sequence, but in those cases the courses listed below must be reflected on the candidate's transcript.

II. RECOMMENDED COURSE CONTENT AND SEQUENCE

Current New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) regulations for certification as a P-12 English teacher requires that a candidate complete a minimum of 30 English credits in a coherent sequence. A coherent sequence requires that at least 12 credits are completed at the advanced level of study (300 level or above – junior, senior or graduate level). All credits must appear on a Rowan transcript as required by the New Jersey Department of Education. Courses and credits accepted by Rowan University that were earned at a different institution (a community college or another university, for example) will appear on the Rowan transcript. Rowan University requirements for admission to the CADP may exceed the NJDOE's requirements for certification. For entry into the CADP, grades for all courses used to meet these requirements must be a C- or better with content area GPA and overall GPA of 3.0 or higher.
