Rowan University Graduation Requirements

- Students must complete at least 120 s.h. (semester hours) of coursework that applies to their Rowan University degree
- A minimum of 30 s.h. of coursework must be completed at/through Rowan University
- Students must apply for graduation and should do so for the term in which they will complete all program requirements.

Program-Specific Graduation & Certification Requirements

- Students must receive a grade of C- or better in all courses required for B.A. in SME
- Students MUST have an overall G.P.A. of at least 3.0 (Only Rowan University courses count toward the G.P.A.)
- All students must meet established Benchmarks to Determine eligibility for Admission to the subject-specific SME English program: Clinical Practice I and Completion of Program see Benchmark Requirement list.
- Students must apply for graduation and teaching certification within the term in which all program requirements are complete
- All students must take and pass the Core Academic Skills for Educators: Praxis Core Basic Skills Tests. See Required Graduation/Certification Tests on p. 2
- All students must take and pass the Praxis II in their teaching discipline: English (test code: 5038). See Required Graduation/Certification Tests on p.2
- All students must take and pass edTPA. See Required Graduation/Certification Tests on p. 2
