## SUBJECT-MATTER SPECIALIZATION: ART

## GUIDELINES FOR DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO EdUCATION PROGRAM, Admission to Clinical Practice, and Completion of Program

All native, transfer, and post-baccalaureate students interested in pursuing K-12 art certification in the Subject-Matter Education program and/or seeking enrollment in Clinical Practice must meet the following requirements:

## For entry into the Art Subject-Matter Education Program (T\&LA Art, T\&LB Art): Benchmark I

1. Overall GPA of 3.0 or above and a GPA of 3.0 for all professional and dual major Art courses (Non-negotiable, nonappealable);
2. Grades of C- or better (no D's, F's, or Incompletes) in all general education, dual major (ART), core or specialization courses required for the B.A. in Education;
3. Successful completion of the following education/foundation courses: Teaching in Learning Communities I \& II, Teaching Reading and Writing in the Content Area, and Educational Technology;
4. "Meets Expectations" on dispositional reports from College of Education instructors and cooperating teachers;
5. Passing score Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators test*: Reading Test (Test Code 5712): Score of at least 156; Writing Test (Test Code 5722): Score of at least 162; and Math Test (Test Code 5732): Score of at least 150; Note: Candidates are exempt from the basic skills requirement if they can demonstrate a score on the SAT, ACT, or GRE at or above the cut score for the year in which they took the exam, as shown here: http://www.state.nj.us/education/educators/rpr/preparation/BasicSkillsExemptionCutScores.pdf
6. Completion of at least 12 semester hours of Required Art and/or Restricted Elective art courses (listed below) for undergraduates, or for Post-baccalaureates, at least 21 semester hours;
7. Passing score on sophomore proficiency (Core Portfolio Review). The sophomore proficiency DOES NOT APPLY to Postbaccalaureates.

## For enrollment in Clinical Practice: Benchmark II

1. Overall GPA of 3.0 or above and a GPA of 3.0 for all professional and dual major Art courses (Non-negotiable, nonappealable);
2. Grades of C- or better (no D's, F's, or Incompletes) in all general education, dual major ART, core or specialization courses required for the B.A. in Education;
3. "Meets Expectations" on dispositional reports from College of Education instructors and cooperating teachers;
4. Passing score (158) on the PRAXIS II exam (Art: Content Knowledge (0134/5134);
5. "Meets Expectations" in Content Knowledge Portfolio and Unit Plan Assessment (T\&LA and T\&LB);
6. Completion of $30+$ semester hours of Required and/or Restricted Elective art courses (listed below).

Art GPA** must be calculated using all required courses and eligible electives; none of these courses are to be excluded in GPA calculation. For transfer, post-baccalaureate, and native students taking any of these courses at other institutions, the Art GPA must be calculated from transcripts and coursework at Rowan.

## For successful program completion:

1. Overall GPA of 3.0 or above and a GPA of 3.0 for all professional and dual major Art courses (Non-negotiable, nonappealable);
2. Grades of C- or better (no D's, F's, or Incompletes) in all general education, core, or specialization courses required for the B.A. in Education;
3. Ratings of at least "Basic" on all performance indicators on the Clinical Practice Performance Evaluation Form and ratings of at least "Meets Expectations" on all performance indicators on Art's SPA Clinical Practice Teacher Candidate Performance Evaluation Form.

Please be aware that any disciplinary or academic sanctions will/may result in extended time for program completion and will prolong graduation.
