After June 2014, Passing score on Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators Exam (Reading: 156; Writing: 162;
Math: 150).
7. Required and/or Non Program music courses (as listed below) completed:

Undergraduates: at least 21 semester hours
8. Passing score on sophomore proficiency

## For enrollment in Clinical Practice:

1. Music GPA of 3.00 or above
