## GUIDELINES FOR DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO MUSIC SUBJECT-MATTER EDUCATION PROGRAM, ADMISSION TO CLINICAL PRACTICE, AND COMPLETION OF PROGRAM

All native and transfer students interested in pursuing K-12 music certification in the Subject-Matter Education program and/or seeking enrollment in Clinical Practice must meet the following requirements:

## For entry into the Subject-Matter Education Program (TnL A & B):

- 1. Music GPA of 3.00 or above
- 2. Grades of C- or better in all music classes
- 3. Grades of C- or higher in "sophomore" courses (i.e., TLC I & II-M, Teaching Literacy, and Educational Technology)
- 4. "Meets Expectations" on dispositional reports from College of Education instructors and cooperating teachers
- 5. Overall GPA of at least 2.75
- 6. **Prior to June 2014,** Passing score on Praxis I/PPST Exam (Reading: 175; Math: 174; Writing: 173) **After June 2014,** Passing score on Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators Exam (Reading: 156; Writing: 162; Math: 150).
- 7. *Required* and/or *Non Program* music courses (as listed below) completed: Undergraduates: at least 21 semester hours
- 8. Passing score on sophomore proficiency

## For enrollment in Clinical Practice:

- 1. Music GPA of 3.00 or above
- 2. Grade of C- or better in all music classes
- 3. Passing score (153) on the PRAXIS II exam (Music: Content Knowledge (10113))
- 4. Average grade of 3.0 in professional education courses with no course grade lower than C- and no *Incompletes*
- 5. Overall GPA of at least 2.75
- 6. Acceptable dispositional report(s) from university instructors and cooperating teachers
- 7. "Meets Expectations" on General and Vocal/Instrumental Resource Notebooks
- 8. Completion of 21 semester hours non program courses and all least 44 semester hours of *Required* music courses (as listed below)

## For successful program completion:

- 1. "Meets Expectations" on all indicators (COE and Music Program-specific) of final Clinical Practice Evaluations
- 2. Overall GPA of 2.75
- 3. Average grade of 3.0 in professional courses with no course grade lower than C- and no *Incompletes*
- 4. Achieve minimum Music GPA (3.00) with no grade lower than C- in music courses
- 5. "Meets Expectations" on Impact on Student Learning Project
- 6. "Meets Expectations" on Clinical Practice Performance Evaluation
