TRANSFER STUDENT - ADMISSION PROCEDURES AND APPLICATION

The College of Education, at Rowan University, has a rich history of preparing highly effective educators for South Jersey and beyond. For over 90 years, the college has been engaged in teacher preparation and professional development undergirded by a commitment to excellence in education and innovation. The College of Education has partnered with Rowan University's Office of Admissions and Division of Student Life, to launch a unique recruitment and retention initiative aligned with the university's strategic priorities in access, affordability, quality and serving as an economic engine.

Procedures for application to the Increasing Male Practitioners and Classroom Teachers (IMPACT) program is as follows:

1. Prior to seeking admission into the IMPACT Program, applicants must have met the admission

requirements and applied to Rowan University College of Education.

2. Applicants must complete a separate online application, specific to the IMPACT program, housed on the following link:

3. In addition to the application to the program, the following items must be submitted:

A. Official copy of current or most recent college transcript.

B. Two letters of recommendation, one (1) from a teacher, guidance counselor, school administrator, or dean of your university, and one (1) from a person of the student's choice who can address the student's involvement in the community and/or potential for entering the field of education. The letter should be sent directly to the link above .

C. An essay that answers “Why I Want to Impact My Community through Education.” The essay should address your motivation for entering the field of education and the contributions you hope to make to the profession and to the community as an educator.

NOTE: All of the requested documents can be uploaded to the online application using the link above. Please make sure to label documents with your full name, and use the subject line to identify yourself and the information being submitted.

4. Following submission of the items above, an interview will be scheduled to ascertain the potential for teaching and the interest in the program. There will also be an opportunity for clarification of any information submitted through the application process.
